These have the flavor of butterscotch with bursts of pecan and chocolate. Along with brownies, these are the bars that always sell at bake sales. (Try a Blond Sundae with vanilla ice cream, butterscotch sauce, and a sprinkling of chopped pecans on top.)

2/3 cup butter or margarine

2 ¼ cups (1 pound) light brown sugar

3 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla

2 ½ cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour

2 ½ teaspoons baking salt

½ teaspoon salt

1 to 2 cups of chocolate, butterscotch or peanut butter chips (optional)

1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Preheat your oven to 350°F

Cream the butter and sugar together until they're very light. Add the eggs and beat thoroughly one at a time. Blend in the vanilla.

Mix the dry ingredients together. Blend the butter mixture with flour mixture. Fold in the chocolate, butterscotch, or peanut butter chips (or a mixture) and spoon the dough onto a lightly greased 10 X 14 baking pan (or use two 8 X 8-inch cake pans.)

Bake for 25 to 30 minutes. Cool, cut into squares and serve.

ADULT RECIPE
Kochen Coq's Ligurian Olive Braid
From King Arthur Cookbook Section IV – 44

This bread was developed by Robin Voight who runs a fledgling baking business in Greenwich, Connecticut, called Kochen Coq's, Inc. Robin's company makes "breads by hand" which are exciting enough to be in demand not only in Connecticut, but also in New York City and as far away as the nation's capital. Robin is a King Arthur niece so is naturally imbued with the King Arthur tradition. We are very pleased that she has graciously agreed to share with us Kochen Coq's "heretofore secret recipe for Ligurian Olive Braid." For those of you who love olives, this bread is ambrosia.

Liguria, whose capital is Genoa, is located on the northwestern coast of Italy. This region grows some of the finest olives in the world. One of its oldest families produces olive "pestos" from both black and green olives. Olive pesto is a combination of olives (either black or green), extra virgin oil, fresh lemon juice, wine vinegar, salt, sugar and herbs. You can find olive pestos in the specialty section of many supermarkets.

"It tastes wonderful sliced thin, brushed with garlic and herb olive oil and toasted until crispy."

Green Olive Pesto Dough

This first dough you make with green olive "Pesto."

1 cup warm water
3 ¾ cups (approximately) King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
1 tablespoon or packet active dry yeast
2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
½ cup olive pesto (recipes can be found online)
1 teaspoon salt

Mixing: Pour the warm water into a mixing bowl. Stir in (as well as you can) 1 cup of flour and the yeast. Let this sit until yeast has dissolved and the whole mixture has expanded.

Stir in the olive oil, pesto and salt. Add the balance of the flour gradually until it begins to pull away from the sides of the bowl as you stir it with a spoon.

Kneading & Rising: Turn dough out into a lightly floured board and knead for three or four minutes or until it becomes cohesive.

Give the dough a rest while you clean out and grease your bowl. When you return to the dough it will be more pliable and "together." Continue kneading until it's soft, smooth and elastic.

Put the dough in a lightly greased bowl, turning it to grease the top. Cover and put aside to let it double in bulk.

Black Olive Pesto Dough

Make this dough just as you did the first but use black olive pesto (recipe can be found online) rather than the green. Put this aside to rise while you make the third dough.

Olive Oil Dough

This dough you make only once.

1 ¼ cups warm water
4 cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
1 tablespoon or packet active dry yeast
1 tablespoon butter
¼ cup extra virgin olive oil
1 teaspoon salt

Wash made of 1 egg white beaten with 1 teaspoon water, kosher or pretzel salt (to sprinkle on top)

Mixing: Pour the warm water in a mixing bowl. Stir in as well as you can 1 cup of flour and the yeast. Let this sit until the yeast has dissolved and the whole mixture has expanded. Stir in the butter, olive oil and salt. Add the balance of the flour gradually until it begins to pull away from the sides of the bowl as you stir it with a spoon.

Kneading & Rising: Follow the same directions as for the pesto doughs.

Catching Up: You may have to knock down the first two doughs and let them begin to rise a second time in order to give the third dough enough time for a complete rise.

Braiding: After all the doughs have doubled at least once, divide each into four equal sized pieces. Roll each of the pieces into a rope about 15 inches long.

Robin braids her breads from the middle to the end. Take three strands of dough, one of each color, and lay them across each other at their midpoints so they look like a 6 pointed star.

Starting with the strand on the bottom, weave each side alternately over the center strand until you get to the end. Pinch the ends together.

Repeat with the other strands until you have 4 loaves. (If you want to divide this dough differently, you can make 3 larger loaves or even 1 huge wreath.)

Place the loaves on a lightly greased baking sheet allowing at least three inches between them for expansion. Cover with a damp towel and let them rise for 1 to 1 ½ hours.

Baking: Fifteen minutes before you want to bake the loaves, preheat the oven to 425°F. Brush the braids with the wash and sprinkle kosher salt on the white part of the braid.

Bake for 25 minutes at 425°F. Turn the oven down to 375°F and bake for a further 20 to 25 minutes. (If you're baking larger loaves, after 20 minutes at 375°F, turn the heat down once more to 350°F and bake a further 10 to 15 minutes depending on size.)

The braids are done when they are golden brown and sound hollow when thumped on the bottom. Cool on a rack. When they are thoroughly cool, seal the ones you want to freeze in airtight plastic bags.
