

Thank you for joining us at Windsor Fair!

Below are the Campground Rules/Guidelines. As a reminder, Windsor is a family-oriented Fair.

1. Campground speed is 5 miles per hour. Please remember that children, the elderly and disabled campers share all areas;
2. One vehicle per campsite. If you have more than one vehicle, there is ample free parking (incl. for those w/ a disability plate or placard). If you have visitors, they must park in the free parking/disabled area.
3. Intoxication, underage drinking, disorderly conduct, fighting and obscene language will not be tolerated and will result in eviction.
4. Quiet time is 11 p.m. – 7:30 a.m. Loud music is not acceptable at any time.
5. No fires (of any sort) are allowed anywhere on the grounds.
6. Animals are welcome in the campground - please do not leave your pet unattended either inside or outside of your camper. Barking, growling, etc. or concerns about their well-being will result in a call to the owner of the camper. If concerns are not properly addressed, we may be forced to contact the local ACO. Please walk your dog in the field/parking areas – you are responsible for cleaning up after your pet. **You must have a current rabies tag/certificate.**
7. The Department of Environmental Protection makes unannounced rounds in all camping areas on the grounds. Dumping gray and/or black water is not acceptable at any time. Water must be in holding tanks and disposed of at one of the dumping stations or by the pump truck. Inspectors are authorized to assess fines. If Windsor Fair is assessed a fine because of your violation, that fee will be passed on to you.
8. Do not leave your vehicle at an empty campsite. Lots are reserved and those who have paid for them may arrive at any time. You would not want to arrive and find a vehicle parked in a site you paid for.
9. It is your responsibility to keep your campsite neat and to take care of your trash. Barrels are placed throughout the campground and are emptied every day.
10. Do not walk through other campsites unless you have been invited to do so. We receive comments/complaints about this every year. Do not dig in or around your site or damage trees.
11. **Those camping in Lots 100 through 190 please take note:** Because we often have issues with vehicles blocking the way of other campers attempting to get their rigs through the rows and parked, we can no longer allow vehicles at the above numbered campsites from 12 noon on Friday through 12 pm on Saturday.
12. Check out time – no later than 11 a.m. except on Labor Day (stay as long as you like!).

NOTE: We have duties in other camping areas on the grounds throughout the week and on Labor Day weekend so we cannot always be in our office. Should you have an emergency or need us for any other reason, please see the folks at Gate 4, the walk-in gate (go back onto the paved driveway by our office, turn to your right and you'll see the little white building which is Gate 4 (aka 'the walk-through gate') will be just ahead of you on the left).
